



Instructors Course

1. Must have passed all three levels or be of a standard of experience deemed suitable to be working problem horses.
2. Display excellent professionalism, presentation and communication skills.
3. Be of the utmost personal and professional integrity.
4. Possess an Advanced First Aid qualification from a recognised first aid training organization from the individual's home country.
5. Possess a teaching or training qualification from a recognised government accredited organization from the individual's home country
6. Make written application to become an Instructor. This application should include the applicant's own plan for professional development and entrepreneurial goals.
7. This application and the applicant's qualifications, personal and horsemanship history will form the basis of adjudication by a panel of Instructors.
8. Agree to attend an annual conference of Queensland Natural Horsemanship professionals,
9. Agree to sign a 'Code of Conduct' agreement governing acceptable behaviour and professional ethics.
